ITEM No. 1: To Read and Confirm the Minutes of the Previous IQAC Meeting

Discussion: The minutes of the previous IQAC meeting were read and reviewed by the members. The progress on the action points discussed in the earlier meeting was noted.

Resolution: The minutes of the previous IQAC meeting were unanimously confirmed.

ITEM No. 2: Review of IQAC Initiatives and Activities

Discussion: The committee reviewed the institutional quality initiatives and academic enhancement activities undertaken during the academic year.

- It was resolved that monthly reports of IQAC activities conducted by various institutional cells should be submitted regularly to IQAC for documentation and quality monitoring.
- Members discussed strengthening digital academic infrastructure, including wider use of Google Classroom/ Learning Management Systems (LMS), IRINS, and smart classroom facilities.
- The implementation of Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) was suggested, and departments were advised to ensure timely compliance with audit requirements.
- Institutional best practices such as Clean Campus, Green Campus initiatives, energy conservation, financial literacy awareness programmes, and digital marketing initiatives were reviewed and appreciated.

- Members emphasised the importance of strengthening Industry–Institute Interaction, placement initiatives, the need for improved administrative digitisation, and AI integration in academic processes
- Strengthening the teaching and learning process by e-content / e-course development

Resolution: The committee unanimously approved the continuation and strengthening of the above quality initiatives with regular monitoring by IQAC.

ITEM No. 3: Discussion on Strengths, Gaps, and Suggestive Measures for Improvement (Action Taken Report 2025–26)

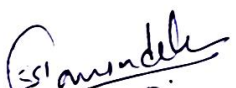
Discussion: The committee discussed institutional strengths and identified areas requiring improvement.

- It was suggested that curriculum feedback be systematically collected from all relevant stakeholders to enhance quality and enrich the curriculum.
- The committee discussed the student–teacher ratio and the need for strategic academic planning to maintain quality learning outcomes.
- Members recommended conducting the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) before examinations to ensure timely analysis and reporting.
- A structured mechanism to identify and support advanced and slow learners was discussed to improve academic intervention.
- New pedagogical approaches to promote innovative teaching practices.
- Members discussed expanding extension activities, social outreach programmes, community engagement initiatives, rural development activities, and environmental awareness programmes.
- It was proposed that activities related to waste management, soil and water testing, and sustainability awareness be strengthened.

Resolution: The committee resolved to implement the suggested improvement measures systematically through concerned departments and institutional cells under IQAC monitoring.
